



Project le Monde, Radnor House Uganda update

We have received an update from Namakoko, Uganda and wanted to share with you how they are managing to cope during the coronavirus pandemic.

All schools and educational establishments have been locked down by President Museveni and staff and children have been told to stay at home. This is difficult for communities because no work means that people have difficulty buying food. The food prices are also rising.

Luckily in rural Namakoko recent rain has meant that crops are growing well and people there have access to locally grown food. In addition, our payment of £1,000 to Project Le Monde has gone to pay the salaries for teachers, a night watchman and the cook so they will be able to buy food for themselves and their families for this month, possibly next month too.

There is a different world to ours and we do not know when lockdown will end but thankfully Uganda has had a relatively low number of CV19 cases.
