Radnor House Sevenoaks - Curriculum Overview Music Year 9



Year 9 pupils receive one classroom lesson each week in Music. There is an opportunity for pupils to have private lessons on any instrument or singing. Co-curricular classes are offered for those who wish to prepare for ABRSM music theory exams and there is considerable take-up for this. Pupils are also encouraged to participate in Concert Band, Choir (which regularly undertakes overseas tours) and the large variety of ensembles, both formal and informal, that exist within the school community. All students are encouraged to take part in our regular musical soirees, either as soloists or in ensembles. At the end of Year 9 pupils can opt to continue with their musical studies by taking GCSE music, which is a popular option. Others continue with their instrumental and/or singing lessons and co-curricular music activities alongside their GCSE studies in other disciplines.

Year 9 are taught in our Performing Arts Centre where teaching methods are integrated to include practical music-making including singing, ukulele and guitar, alongside use of technology including keyboards, music sequencing and notation software.
